



Seoul Museum of Craft Art

Korea's first public craft art museum opened in 2021, it showcases craft arts from all eras and genres, from the Joseon period when the skills of craftsmen fully blossomed, to the modern period that absorbed Western culture and the Japanese Colonial period when industrial craft emerged. Many of the items on display are an integral part of our daily lives, such as clothes, ornaments and furniture, making it easy for visitors of all ages to understand Korea's unique stylishness, even without any elaborate explanations.

Museum Kimchikan

One of the top 11 food museums in the world selected by CNN, it is Korea's first kimchi museum that opened in 1986. It is noted for its program of exhibition and participation, augmented by visual and audio information on Korea's unique food 'Kimchi' and the 'Kimjang culture (making and sharing of kimchi)', the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity designated by UNESCO, making the entire experience more fun and exciting than the typical one-sided exhibitions based on informational material that provides explanations and introductions. There are participation programs for children and foreign tourists, as well as docent tours for visitors of all ages.

Yhlayuen Seal Engraving Lab

Seal engraving, the art of engraving letters and drawings with a knife, is a traditional art form of East Asia. At the Yhlayuen Seal Engraving Lab, you can experience seal artworks with exquisite Hangeul directly engraved upon them. Besides the engraving of unique seals by hand, rather than based on predetermined fonts, there are a variety of participation programs you can enjoy, such as making Hangeul calligraphy products, written with strokes that resemble an elegant dance.

Royal Refreshments at Korea House Royal Kohojae

'Korea House' was built for the purpose of introducing Korea's traditional culture. It was built by the National Intangible Cultural Asset and Master Carpenter Shin Eungsoo, and is a replica of the Jagyeongjeon Hall of Gyeongbokgung Palace. It provides a variety of traditional experiences, such as traditional weddings and royal tables, but the most casual way to access them is through 'Royal Refreshments' at 'Kohojae'. Kohojae offers a royal table for a single person, composed of rice cakes, Hangwa (traditional Korean sweets), Byeonggwa (rice cakes or sweets) using seasonal ingredients and traditional tea, fully capturing the sweetness of the seasons for your pleasure.

Namsangol Hanok Village

A village built by relocating and restoring five traditional Hanoks designated as folklore records by the City of Seoul. The interior of the Hanoks that embody the lives of our ancestors are designed as a place for experiencing Korean tradition, while the spacious yard and garden provide space to enjoy and view spectacles, such as traditional weddings and games. A variety of programs, including indoor activities, conducted regardless of the weather and season, and traditional games played outdoors offer opportunities to participate and have fun for visitors of all ages.

From the Hwaseong Fortress in Suwon, the greatest fortress of the Joseon period recognized as UNESCO's World Culture Heritage, all the way to Yeoju that showcases magnificent scenery, reminding one of the grandeur of an Oriental painting. Let's take an unconventional trip and experience the architecture and culture of Joseon. You may not be able to close your mouth once you are overwhelmed by its sheer scale and stylishness.

Suwon Hwaseong Fortress

Hwaseong Fortress in Suwon is regarded as the pinnacle of Korea's fortress culture, and was designated as UNESCO's World Culture Heritage. Hwaseong Fortress is sometimes called the 'Leaf Fortress', as the curvy walls resemble a leaf when seen from above. This is symbolical of King Jeongjo's love for the people, who declared 'Do not inconvenience the people. Bend and straighten the fortress three times if you must,' a measure taken to minimize the impact on the livelihood of people living near the path of the fortress.

Hwaseong Haenggung (Temporary Palace at Hwaseong Fortress)

Hwaseong Haenggung is a temporary palace (Haenggung) used to accommodate kings when they were visiting rural regions. A royal palace with over 600 rooms built by King Jeongjo when the Hwaseong Fortress was being constructed, it is regarded as the greatest temporary palace from the Joseon period in terms of size and form. The Hwaseong Haenggung, built by King Jeongjo for the purpose of mingling with the people, is now used as a venue for cultural events for the people to enjoy, such as the Suwon Cultural Festival and nighttime opening of the palace.

Korean Folk Village

The typical phrase 'Traditional theme park recreating the Joseon period' is not sufficient to fully express the dynamic aspect of the Korean Folk Village. Different events are performed during different seasons of the year and time of day, and characters from the Joseon period that seem to have traveled through time to the present day put on an unforgettable show. Visitors can enjoy housing sites that reenact the lives of our ancestors, traditional experiences, amusement parks, and also use the marketplace to satisfy the hunger from all the excitement.

Climb up to the glorious 2-storey Yeongweolru Pavilion and look across the river, and you will witness the mystic beauty of Silleuksa Temple engulfed by the green forest and the magnificent open scenery of the Namhangang River. Let us not forget about the Hwangpo Dotbae experience, the center of the scenery that completes the entire picture. Hwangpo Dotbae is a traditional boat that was used for fishing and transportation of materials in the past, and is now used for sightseeing.

How would you define the Korean people? Well, they are the 'Joyful people' constantly humming with joy, even when in solitude! Let's travel to Chungcheongbuk-do and search for traces of the original spirit of joy that we have inherited. Let's also take a sip of the traditional wine, the magical elixinthat has passed down through four generations since the Joseon period that is sure to put you in the mood for fun, and sing along to Nongyo (Farmer's Song), the original work song. You won't be able to control yourself from dancing.

Jung-Wondang

The second Intangible Cultural Asset designated by Chungcheongbuk-do is 'liquor'? Korea's renowned traditional wine 'Cheongmyeongju' is the liquor in question, the brewing method of which was recorded in 'Hyangjeonrok', a document belonging to the Gimhae Kim clan based in Cheongju, Chungcheongbuk-do, and recognized as sustaining the taste and legacy of Joseon. Cheongmyeongju is prestigious liquor, made from native ingredients and brewed through 100 days of fermentation and maturing. Visitors can experience the brewing of traditional wines and taste traditional soju at Jung-Wondang, the brewery responsible for keeping the tradition of 'Cheongmyeongju' alive and well.

Located in the center of the Korean Peninsula and historically having played the role of a transportation hub, Jeungpyeong, Chungcheongbuk-do is a city that has developed its cultural assets along the path of man's footsteps. The 'Jeungpyeong Folk Museum' is here, a place where we can experience the joy and style of our ancestors. We should take note of the 'Duregwan' where 'Jangddeul Dure Nongyo' is performed, the Nongyo that was handed down only in this region. Jeungpyeong is the place to go if you want to truly appreciate the art of the original work song 'Nongyo' written by the people who embraced the concept of joy.

Although passenger trains no longer pass through this station, it is sometimes used for military transport, so be careful not to take pictures on the tracks as it is strictly prohibited!

The place where BTS member Suga(Agust D)'s music video of <Daechwita> from his second mix tape was filmed. The site that reproduces the streets and residential areas from the time of the Three Kingdoms to the Joseon period is the biggest open filming location in Korea, and a center of Hallyu tourism where historical mini-series such as <Jumong>, <Lee San, Wind the of Palace>, and <The Moon Embracing the Sun> were filmed, as well as the music video of <Daechwita>. From palaces that radiate glory of the past to the streets that become photo zones wherever you stand, there is not a single moment you can afford to lose here.

Seohuri Forest

The famous BTS photobook that heals the soul of the reader was taken at the Seohuri Forest in Yangpyeong. Seohuri Forest is an arboretum covering 100,000 pyeong (approx. 3,300 acres) of land that was used as the filming site for BTS's 2019 Season's Greetings, and is well known for its grand spectacle of the landscape created by the natural forest, which was the original intent when it was initially developed. Photos of BTS members are on display at the photo zones, making it ideal to take pictures in the same spot with the same angle. The walking trail is divided into a 1-hour and a 30-minutes course depending on the distance.



The bridge, built exclusively for travelers, is 200m long, 2m wide and 50m high from the river bed. The bulletproof glass floor midway adds thrill to the excitement, but you needn't be concerned, as the sturdy bridge was designed to accommodate 1,500 adults at once.

Meonguri Canyon is the spot that best displays the formation of lava that once flowed through the Hantangang River. The 30~40m-high U-shaped canyons formed by erosion of the river and the asymmetric canyons on both sides combine with the columnar joints to create quite a spectacle.



Ganghwado is a popular destination for family trips as it is close to the metropolitan area and offers a variety of experiences to enjoy with children. From the huge dolmens we only saw in history textbooks to the exciting space experience and delightful mud flats! Let's begin the first day of our family trip at Ganghwado and arouse our senses where there are so many things to enjoy.

Ganghwa Dolmen Sites

Ganghwa is called the 'Roofless Museum' because of the more than 150 dolmens distributed throughout the region. The dolmen at Bugeun-ri, Hajeommyeon, Ganghwa-do (Historical Landmark #137) is a dolmen that represents Korea. It is a Northern-style dolmen, and its dimensions are 71m in length, 26m in height, and 55m in width. It was designated as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage in 2000, along with the dolmens in Gochang and Hwasun.

Byeolmaro Observatory
